



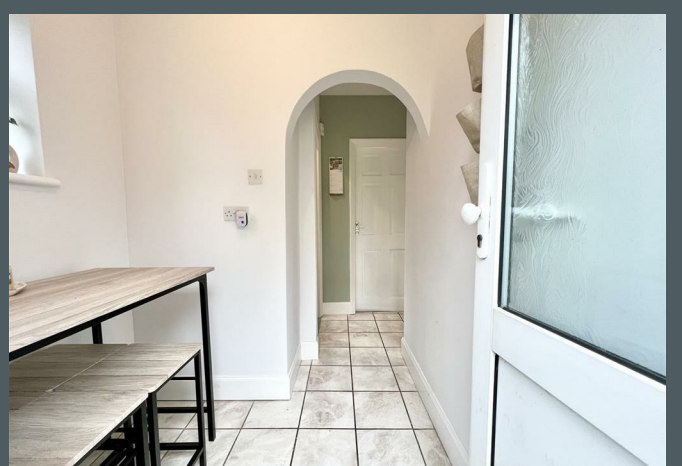
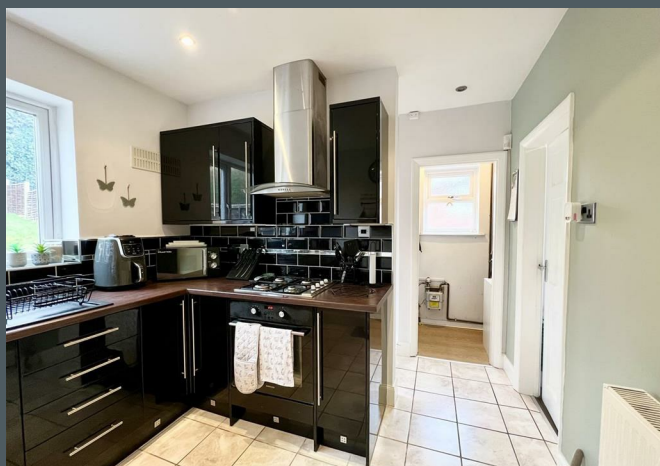

The layout in brief comprises of entrance hallway with stairs to first floor, a well appointed lounge with feature gas fire place and a modern kitchen leading through to pantry and dining area. Heading upstairs is a pleasant landing with loft access, two good sized double bedrooms with the main bedrooms featuring the addition of a built in walk-in wardrobe and the recently updated house bathroom. Externally the property is accessed via a landscaped front garden with steps leading to front door, and side access to rear. At the rear is a slabbed seating near to property, with a large lawned area with further raised decking area, and space for shed storage at the base of the garden. AF 7/2/24 V1 EPC=D







### Location

Halesowen lies approximately 7 miles from Birmingham City Centre and is just minutes away from junction 3 of the M5 motorway, giving access to the greater motorway network all around the West Midlands. The History of Halesowen stems back as far as the Anglo Saxons and it was listed in the Domesday Book as being larger than Birmingham. It forms part of the southern edge of the Black Country and during the industrial revolution it became synonymous with nail and screw making, an industry that still survives to a lesser extent today. Despite its proximity to the Black Country it still retains areas of beauty. Leasowes Park is thought to be one of the first natural landscaped gardens in England. Certain areas of the town have retained a certain number of Victorian houses but further development during the 1960's and 70's saw the building of several large housing estates. It has a number of highly sought after primary and secondary schools. Whilst Halesowen no longer has a train station of its own, the Worcester to Birmingham line passes along the northern edge of its boundary and the stations of Cradley Heath, Old Hill and Rowley Regis are all within a few miles of the town centre. Halesowen's bus station is a busy interchange and a regular service runs to Birmingham City Centre.

### Approach

Via steps leading to front door with lawn area to the side with mature shrubbery and bushes, gate to side providing access to rear.

### Entrance hall

Double glazed door, ceiling light point, central heating radiator.

### Lounge 12'9" max 11'9" min x 11'5" (3.9 max 3.6 min x 3.5)

Double glazed window to front, ceiling light point, central heating radiator, gas fireplace and laminate flooring.

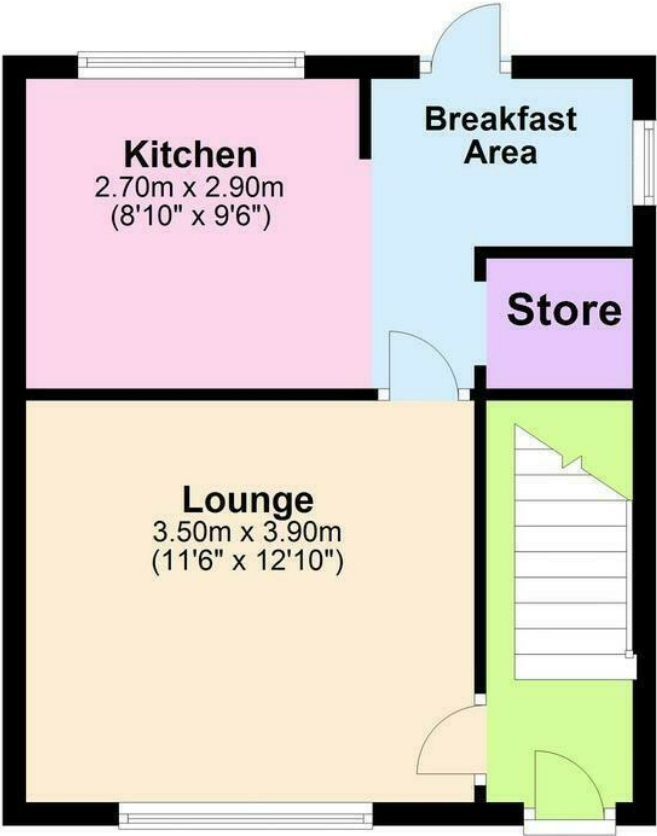




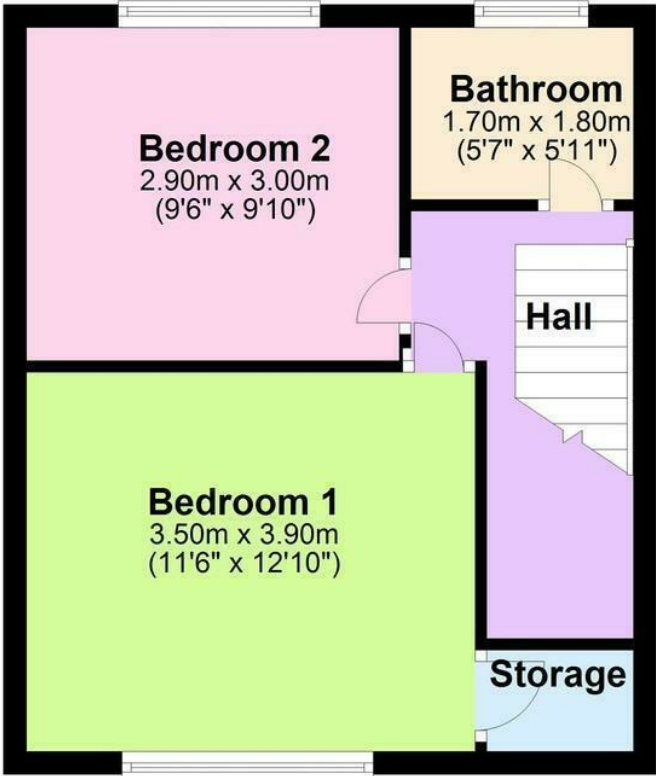




**Ground Floor**

### **Kitchen 8'10" x 9'6" (2.7 x 2.9)**

Double glazed window to rear, ceiling spotlights, range of wall and base units, wood effect work surfaces over, gas hob, extractor, electric oven, one and a half bowl sink and drainer, space for fridge freezer, central heating radiator, tiled flooring.

### **Breakfast area 4'7" x 5'10" (1.4 x 1.8)**

Door and double glazed window, ceiling light point, tiled flooring.

### **Store**

Under stairs store used as a pantry, housing fuse board, double glazed window and ceiling light point.

### **First floor landing**

Double glazed window to side, ceiling light point, loft access.

### **Bedroom one 11'5" x 10'2" (3.5 x 3.1)**

Double glazed window to front, central heating radiator, ceiling light point, built in store/walk in wardrobe.

### **Bedroom two 9'6" x 9'10" (2.9 x 3.0)**

Double glazed window to rear, ceiling light point, central heating radiator.

### **Bathroom**

Double glazed window to rear, ceiling spotlights, majority tiled walls, heated towel rail, P shaped bath with shower over, wash hand basin and cupboard, low level flush w.c. and laminate flooring.

### **Rear garden**

Slabbed seating area, steps to good sized lawn area with further decked seating area.

### **Tenure**
