Grade II Listed Early 18th Century Farmhouse – A Rare Renovation Opportunity

This charming Grade II listed early 18th Century farmhouse offers a wonderful opportunity to restore and modernise a period home of real character. Retaining many original features, including beamed ceilings, open fireplaces, sash windows, and stone detailing, the property exudes traditional charm and heritage throughout.

Accessed via a paved pathway leading to the front door, the property opens into a kitchen fitted with a range of dated wall and floor units, tiled flooring, and a useful storage cupboard. A door leads through to a spacious pantry/utility room featuring original stone shelving, stone flooring, and windows to the front and side. To the rear of the farmhouse are two generously proportioned reception rooms, each with open fireplaces, offering great potential for elegant and comfortable living spaces once modernised.

Upstairs, the property offers four well-sized bedrooms, including three doubles and a large single with fitted cupboard. The family bathroom is particularly spacious, comprising a bath with shower over, WC, and wash hand basin, with scope to reconfigure the layout to create an additional bathroom or a larger fourth bedroom if desired.

Externally, the gardens lie mainly to the front and side, enclosed by attractive stone walling and mature hedging, and are largely laid to lawn with space to landscape further. There is also a stone coal shed.

Offering immense potential, this historic farmhouse presents an exciting opportunity to create a truly special home, blending period architecture with modern comfort in a beautiful rural setting.

Nestled just a mile west of Hawes, the picturesque hamlet of Appersett sits at the head of Wensleydale where the River Ure and Widdale Beck meet. Surrounded by rolling hills, waterfalls, and unspoilt countryside, it offers a tranquil rural setting while being only a few minutes' drive from the vibrant market town of Hawes, famed for its shops, cafés,







weekly market, and the Wensleydale Creamery. Appersett is the perfect location for those seeking peace and natural beauty without sacrificing easy access to local amenities.
